Physical Demand	Description
SITTING:	To write reports and answer the phone in the office, enter info into computer
WALKING:	On all types of surfaces; primarily on dirt, asphalt or concrete; sometimes on rough terrain, rock or uneven ground.
LIFTING:	Dead and live animals; frequent weights of 1- 50 pounds; occasional weights of 50-100 pounds or more with co-worker; most lifting is from ground level to waist level; lifting of dog food, cat food, and litter of 10 - 50 pounds; occasional lifting of mobile cages to transport animals - 10 pounds plus weight of the animal with co-worker. Lifting from ground to waist or shoulder level.
HANDLING:	To perform most aspects of the job.
PUSHING/PULLING	pulling to get animals out of the truck (animal weights as above under LIFTING); to push open main gates of shelter-over 25 pounds exertion, at least 10 times/day; other gates and cage doors-20 pounds exertion.
VISION:	To observe animals; complete paperwork.
HEARING/TALKING:	To communicate with the public; and other city personnel.
FINE DEXTERITY:	To complete reports; take messages; complete logs.
BENDING:	To pick up animals; feed and water animals; clean lower cages; pick up dog and cat food and litter; put tags on animals; inspect animals.
REACHING:	Into the back of the truck or back of a cage to retrieve animals-at arms length or farther; occasional reaching overhead to retrieve animals from overhead cages.
KNEELING/ CROUCHING:	To pick up animals from the ground (10-20 times/day); to feed animals.
TWISTING:	To leash animals that resist.
CARRYING:	To move animals from kennel to kennel (weights of animals are described in LIFTING).

MACHINES, TOOLS, EQUIPMENT AND WORK AIDES

Camera, telephone, radio, computer, catch pole, cat tongs, leash rope, and animal cages.
Pressure Washer, Carbon Monoxide Tank

ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS

Frequent work outside with exposure to cold, heat and humidity; frequent risk of physical injury from wild or mean animals; exposure to noise in shelter from barking dogs; occasional threats from agitated individuals; occasional exposure to carbon monoxide while euthanizing animals; frequent exposure to chemical substances used at animal shelter: Clorox and other cleaning supplies; Seven Dust, Amdro, Dursban, and other pest control chemicals.

- Must put forth an effort to re-home as many animals as possible.
